

January 1 is a legal holiday in the United States and many other parts of the world. Some churches have special services to pray for a good year. Past times are remembered with nostalgia, and English-speaking people sing the New Year song, "Auld Lang Syne."

Italian-Americans feel a sense of pride in celebrating the New Year because the calendar and principal traditions are of Italian origin. The Italian New Year salutation is "Buon Anno!" – Happy New Year!







FACT: Columbus Sailed the Ocean Blue in 1492.

Dear Fellow Members of the Order of the Sons and Daughters of Italy in America,

A radio program on UBN on October 13, 2017 called Truth Be Told recently interviewed the Commission of Social Justice's President Kevin A. Caira and OSDIA/CSJ Reps from California/Nevada, Colorado, and New York: Tony Ricevuto, Jerry Carleo, and John A. Fratta respectively. The radio discussion was enlightening to many listeners.

My sister and I would like to add to that discussion with some thoughts.

- c. Who are "they"? They apparently are an underground grassroots-organization whose members then come forth, surrounding the wagons and attacking in secrecy, often taking us by total surprise!
- B. We learned a great deal from the Truth BeTold October 13, 2017 radio interview mentioned above and we hope everyone has listened-in.
- C. We learned a lot at the Columbus Day Celebration on October 1, 2017 at the L.A. Columbus Celebration at the Casa Italiano.
- 1. Yes, perhaps many Italians are too comfortable and have become complacent.
- $2. \ \mbox{Yes},$ the millennial generation knows what they should do, but they just do what they want.
- D. Let us continue to unite! We know that the OSDIA, its Foundation, and CSJ are all working very hard in defense of our Italian-American culture and our right to celebrate and are very happy that the Knights of Columbus are joining us in this on-going struggle. This underhanded attack on heritage and history is very dangerous to the whole wide world. But it is also racist, discriminatory, and anti-Catholic!
- E. We do not know if the Commission on Social Justice (various OSDIA Lodges, as well as the Knights of Columbus) is already taking this approach, but this is what we discussed as we brainstormed.
- 1. We need a legal team of lawyers with a constitutional knowledge of the intricacies of the Constitution and its Bill of Rights. These lawyers and this document are our finest weapons!
- 2. We need to find out how the naysayers communicate and listen-in on their communications to discover what is being planned. (We need to tune-in to radio and T.V. channels, newspapers, computer sites, or other social media being used in this negative campaign.) We need to anticipate what is being planned by the intensity of the rhetoric used.
 - 3. We must defeat surprise!
- a. We refer to the unexpected removal of any mention of Columbus in some San Francisco public school history textbooks;
- b. We point to the tricky-unfair methods used in L.A. like the arbitrary changing of dates for the L.A. City Council Meeting many times and then the tactic of not even providing time for speakers to voice their descent! All this was part of the Council's obvious pre-decision used to remove Columbus Day from the Los Angeles City Calendar.
- C. We refer to the deceptive method used to gain approval for the removal of a Columbus statue in San Jose... to name a few...
- d. If we have a heads-up, we have a good chance to keep this anti-Columbus movement off balance thru court injunctions or by suing them for interfering with our rights under the Constitution. Even if we don't win all the time, court actions will throw them off balance and cost them money.

- F. What is the advantage in changing a date, a name? This is a sinister method that can be used to cause disequilibrium within the Italian-American Community and in the World at large. But "they" will not stop with us...they wish to erase what seems like ancient history (The history of Genoa, Italy and Palos, Spain), saying that it is time to move-on. They would like Columbus' and other statues in our country taken down or destroyed...because they wrongly think they can erase the past by removing a visual object or editing historical documents. Trying to fully-change, to erase, or eradicate history is a fool's task....but at the same time, they have set a very dangerous course to sail! (While we cannot erase the past or defend it, we have the opportunity to learn from it.) And we have news for them. America doesn't have ancient history. We are still a very young Nation compared to most of the rest of the World. Not even 300 years old.
- G. Is this a question of Religion and Culture? Is this a conspiracy against Religion, the most stabilizing element in civilized cultures? We all felt this attack starting with the taking down of Christmas manger scenes. In fact, businesses nationally for a time felt they could not have their workers say Merry Christmas but instead they were told to say Happy Holidays. Then they attacked memorial crosses placed on the top of mountains, and later on our own Los Angeles City Seal they removed the cross on the top of a California mission picture, etc. Do you think this was accomplished by the same "They"? At our L.A. Columbus event on October 1, someone said they are now going after Thanksgiving Day celebrations...
- H. What to do? What to do? An article in a recent <u>L.A. Times</u> Sunday edition (October 8th or October 15th,2017) called "Confederates, Columbus, and Everyone else" by Stephen Marche suggested that although statues of Columbus were often raised to celebrate the contributions of Italian-American immigrants, the naysayers are gunning for Catholic symbols, Columbus being a Catholic..."because such statues are part of a conspiracy to establish Catholicism". (Quote marks pinpoint what was said by a member of the Ku Klux Klan.)
 - 1. Let us ask the authorities why they apparently have not even tried to apprehend and prosecute vandals of statues! Surveillance equipment could be used...Are Indians or others doing this in New York, Phoenix, and other places? Let's find out.
 - 2. So what may be suggested here: It would be wise to stop defending all the aspects of the life of a navigator and explorer of a way-different time and milieu which no one living today really can understand and instead focus on the pride Italian-American immigrants and Italian-Americans living today take pride—in: the fact that this navigator and explorer, Columbus, gathered knowledge for many years, had faith in God and a plan, waited in Spain about 9 years before he could present this plan to the rulers of Spain, and, when succeeding to explain this plan, sailed to his destiny with the hope of establishing a new trade route to the Indies and with the desire to spread a Faith he held dear. (His journals verify this.)
- I. On October 22, 2017, an article in <u>The L.A. Times</u> Sunday edition: "New monuments to Confederacy rise as others fall" by Jenny Jarvie tells us that, from 2000 to the present in America, Confederate memorials have been growing in many Southern states because those who died in the Civil War were sons (and ancestors) of Americans whether they thought the North or South was right about states' rights, sectionalism, or slavery. They lived and died and that history cannot be eradicated! Now many of these memorials cannot be legally-removed because they were made with private money and were placed on private property...
 - 1. So what may be suggested here: Continue to raise-up Columbus statues when statues are taken down...because Columbus lived and died and is part of the World's history!
 - 2. Focus on placing these statues on private property, perhaps in the vicinity to where they were taken down....

In Conclusion: Manger scenes, crosses on mountains, a cross on a mission building on a government seal, Columbus statues, Confederate memorials.... Who or what will "they" attack next?



Italian Consul General Visits North Bay Fire Victims

On Friday, November 10, the Hon. Lorenzo Ortona, Italian Consul General in San Francisco, went to Santa Rosa to meet with members of the North Bay Italian community that were impacted by October's disastrous fires in the area. Also present was the Consul's lovely wife, Sheila Pierce-Ortona, members of the Consulate, as well as members of COMITES. It was the Consul General's desire to listen to persons affected, and be updated and have an exchange of views on how to possibly assist those who suffered immeasurable losses.

The meeting was hosted by the Santa Rosa Lodge, and held at their meeting hall at the Brookwood Mobile Estates. The program began with a warm welcome from Lodge President Joan Acquistapace and Immediate Past State President Lynn Lawrence-Murphy, followed by the Italian and American anthems sung by yours truly and the invocation given by Jerry Caine. Messages from State President John Costa, and National President Vera Girolami, who were both unable to attend, were shared. Over 85 persons were in attendance, and were treated to a delicious turkey dinner with all the trimmings, as catered by the Union Hotel of Occidental as well as members of the North Bay lodges. After dinner the Consul General spoke and expressed his heartfelt solidarity with those who had suffered damage or lost their homes, and offered the assistance of the Italian Consulate in replacing Italian passports and important Italian documents and any other aid that might be needed in these areas. Those in attendance remarked how wonderful and special it was to have the Consul General come up to the area, meet the community, and offer to help. His concern was most appreciated.

The Consul then invited Clint St. Martin, a former Marine and a volunteer firefighter, to speak to the audience. Clint described his life-saving actions as a first responder, and how he and his fellow first responders saved many people that first night of the firestorm by warning residents of the impending disaster and getting them out of their homes. Thankfully, people were spared their lives, but sadly, this selfless hero lost his own home, and came frighteningly close to being surrounded by the fire. When Clint finished his spellbinding story he was

given a standing ovation for his bravery and heroism in the line of duty. Regretfully, there were several people in attendance that lost their homes, but thanks to the courageous actions of others, they were able to escape the raging inferno.

Lodge President Joan then spoke and described how she spent 14 days working at the Vet's Memorial Building during the fire as an RN, helping set up and then working in the 'hospital', handling the evacuations of both Kaiser and Sutter hospitals, as well as a few SNFs (Skilled Nursing Facilities) and some private care homes (Assisted Living). Sister Joan was in charge of the supplies and medications for the whole place; interfacing with the **Emergency Operations Cen**ter and other shelters. They performed 'MacGyver medicine', working with what they had - and they didn't always have what the doctor wanted. After two weeks, shelter transitioned from a medical model to a Red Cross organizational model, releasing the need for licensed nurses. Another hero in this unimaginable disaster.

State officers present at the event in addition to our Immediate Past State President Lynn were State Trustees of the North Bill Murphy and Ray Bini, and State Trustee Central Louise Silacci who brought her mother Loretta from Petaluma with her. Also present was Past State President Arturo Ibleto who brought some of his wine (he looks great at 91!), and Medical Charities Chair Mike Carroll and wife Karen from Sonoma. Visiting Lodge Presidents included Paul Grant from Valley of the Moon Lodge of Sonoma and his mother Josephine, Ann Albertoni from the Cesare Battisti Lodge of Petaluma, and Pam Bini of the Beatrice Portinari Lodge of Vallejo with member Donna Branch. Gloria Garibaldi and the Murphys came from the Napa/St. Helena lodges, Doreen Venturi came from the Ukiah Lodge, and Louie Lodi from the Sacramento Lodge serenaded the assembly with songs. There was also representation from two branches of the ICF, the North Bay Italian Cultural Foundation, and the Italian American.

As liaison between the Sons and Daughters of Italy and the Italian Consulate for this event, I wish to express my deepest gratitude to Santa Rosa Lodge President Joan Acquistapace, who was able to successfully put this dinner meeting togeth-

er on very short notice. As a former Marine herself, Joan took charge and did an outstanding job, along with her co-chairs, Lynn Lawrence-Murphy and husband Bill, who donated their wine and helped coordinate the food. Committee members include Sue Tunstall, Ruth and Fred Acquistapace, Santa Rosa Lodge State Deputy Doreen Venturi, and other OSDIA members who graciously donated their time, talents, and food to make


this event successful. This evening was a great group effort....a family-style get together that offered unity, compassion, and a healing message for those who needed it most.





Commission For Social Justice

Commission for Social Justice continues to convince cities and states throughout the United States to recognize Christopher Columbus for his achievements and recognitions and not portray him as an aggressor who provoked rampage and destruction among Native Americans. We, as Italian-Americans, knowledge and grateful that our forefathers were able to travel to the Americas at great risk leaving their homeland and seeking a better life for our generations. Italian-Americans have contributed so much to making this country great and have endured mistreatment and ridicule throughout the years.

Notwithstanding, our ancestors were able to enjoy their new life and freedom. They treasure freedom and work hard to obtain a legacy for us. They also endured hardship and they were classified as enemy aliens who might show sympathy to the enemy during World War 11.


National president Vera Girolami, shared a letter she received from Chet Campanella an 86-year-old Italian-American, who was detained by our country and interned along with his family as an "Enemy Aliens". In 1942 there were over 695,000 Italian immigrants in the United States. More than 1900 would be taken into custody and detained under wartime restrictions. Italians along with Japanese Americans and German-Americans suffer the same consequences in camps not able to work or own businesses or take care of their families. Mr. Campanella described the mistreatments and injustices during this period. Italian-Americans were forced to be fingerprinted, photographed and given alien identification booklets which they had to carry as identification. Their houses and businesses were searched without search warrants and some of their properties and possessions were confiscated. Families who were displaced were discriminated against because they were Italian-Americans and had a hard time finding work or lodging, waiting for their loved ones to be released. The government kept these mistreatment and injustice as classified information and were not released to the public. At the same time, Italian men and sons were fighting and dying for freedom as military soldiers. The Japanese that were interred received reparations and apologies. Each Japanese survivor re-

ceived \$20,000. Mr Campanella wrote two congressional bills H.R. 1706 that request the Secretary of Education grant \$3 million to be used to educate the American population on these horribleness treatments. H.R. 1707 requested a formal public apology from our government for the mistreatment of Italians during this period. He requested that you contact your Congressional Representative and Speaker of the House, Paul Ryan, to support and bring both bills to the house for a vote.

I pray that everyone is enjoying their Thanksgiving dinners with families and friends and remembering our Italian brothers and sisters that have served in the United States military or as law enforcement officers and first responders. They have sacrificed their time and lives supporting our great country. Italian-Americans are known to be a patriotic nationality who loves our country and Italy.
