

Commission for Social Justice

An Italian/American Veteran by Tony Ricevuto

On Veterans Day the Las Vegas Review Journal ran a front-page article title, "I died in 1944". This article was written by Keith Rogers who interviewed Americo Benetti. His B24 bomber aircraft returning from a bomber mission was shot down attempting to return to their base in Italy. Mr. Benetti is a 94-year-old ex-prisoner of war who currently resides in Las Vegas, NV. I was immediately interested in Mr. Benetti's life and obtain permission from Mr. Rogers and his editor, Mike Hengel to use the story for this article and to interview Mr. Benetti.

The Review Journal's article is quite long and I will paraphrase some of it in order to provide information concerning the ordeal that developed the story. I was more interested in Mr. Benetti's Italian heritage and how he came to become a US citizen.

Mr.Benetti was born in San Abrosio, Italy (near Milan) on November 24, 1921. His father left for America to join his two brothers who worked as stonemasons in San Fernando, California and that's why he was named Americo. His father wanted to leave Italy. "My dad and Mussolini didn't get along." He would return to his native soil 16 years later to fight Benito Mussolini's fascist forces who had teamed with Adolf Hitler's Nazi Germany. He was brought to the United States by his mother when he was 7 years old and he traveled from Ellis Island by train to Los Angeles, California. He learned English and attended high school. In 1941 WWII started. Rather than wait to be drafted, he joined the US Army Air Corps in January 1942. He was assigned as a dive bomber/gunner on a Douglas A-20 Boston Havoc aircraft that was a lowflying bomber. After several tragedies and loss of lives, the Government disbanded the aircraft which was replaced with the B24. In 1943 he was assigned to the 459 bomber group 758th squadron near Bari, Italy. His position was the bottom gunner which was considered the most dangerous position in the aircraft. During this mission "we saw one plane blowup and 2 other take direct hits. Our plane loss 3 engines and we could not keep up with the formation." They were on their way back to their base in Italy when his aircraft was attacked by Nazi fighter planes and he was severely wounded. He actually saw the Nazi fighter coming in at him from the tail end of his plane. "This was in range and I was shooting him and I knew I had him because I was looking at the tracers". The waste gunner on the aircraft was killed which gave the German fighters a position not covered. From his perch under the belly

of the aircraft, Benetti saw 2 flashes from each wing of the attacking plane. "All of a sudden my leg, my thigh my arm my left shoulder and my left eye was gone, the bullets rip through his flesh." The German pilot returned and strafed the bomber from front to back. He secured his parachute stood up and noticed one of his friends in the airplane was sitting down as if he was praying, but he was dead. He was able to emerge from the bottom turret and as he stood up he fell out of the bomb bay doors". "I don't remember how I opened the chute. I don't remember nothing".

He survived the descent landed in a Hungarian farmland. "I lay there and I hear, gobble, gobble, gobble, gobble. Oh I landed a turkey farm and thought I saw 2 turkeys'. When I woke up there were people with pitchforks and clubs all around me and I passed out". He remembered three German officers put him on a cart but he passed out again. He was eventually placed in a prison hospital in Hungary. To his surprise a young German officer came and saluted me. He told me, "I am the pilot that shot you that's why I'm here. To see if you were dead or what. I followed you all the way down because I thought you were dead. The pilot said he was glad he did not kill him, saluted him and took off". The remainder of the war he was hopscotching from prisoner of war hospitals and camps to another.

After being liberated as a POW in 1945 by Patton's 3^{rd} Army he was eventually flown to Modesto, California for additional operations and recuperation. While at the hospital he met his wife Mary Anne who was assigned to the Women's Army Corps and they were married on August 12th, 1945. He retired from the military on January 26, 1946 as a Staff Sergeant and was awarded the POW Medal, Air Medal, and Europe/ Africa Middle East Medal. He return to San Fernando, California and worked for the city of Los Angeles for 27 years. He eventually moved to Colorado and operated several businesses. In 1986 he moved to Las Vegas and worked for American West airlines for 17 years until his retirement. His wife died in May, 2014 after 68 years of marriage. All three of Mr. Benetti's sons served in the Vietnam War, one died of Agent Orange exposure in 2011. He is buried next to Mr. Benetti's wife at the Southern Nevada veteran's memorial cemetery in Boulder City, NV. Mr. Benetti is 100% disabled and resides alone near the Airport. He's very proud of his Italian heritage and that he is an American citizen who emigrated from Italy and was able to serve his new

country.

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart was born in Salzburg, Austria, on January 27, 1756. He was educated by his father, Leopold Mozart, who was concertmaster for the court orchestra of the archbishop of Salzburg and a celebrated vio-Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart started to play harpsichord when he was only 3 years old, and by the age of 5 he was composing music. His older sister also had musical talent. When Mozart was only 6 years old and she was 10, they gave concerts in Munich and Vienna.

Mozart's first published works, four sonatas for harpsicord and violin, were published when he was only 8 years old. Three years later the Holy Roman Emperor, Joseph II, paid him to compose a light opera, and the Empress Maria Theresa asked him to compose a mass for her. He composed it and conducted it himself in her presence. This led to Mozart's appointment as concert master of the cathedral at

Mozart became unhappy with the position when a new archbishop critical of music was appointed, but he could not resign according to the custom of the time until he reached the age of 21 years. By the time he reached 21 and resigned, he had composed more than two hundred works, including grand operas, masses, and symphonies. He was the finest pianist in Europe, one of the first organists, and one of the best violinists.

In 1769 he made an extensive tour of Italy. In Mantua, the Societa Filarmonica gave a concert of Mozart's music in his honor. In Milan, Mozart received a commission to write an opera seria. In Bologna, Mozart was elected an honorary member of the Accademia Filarmonica after passing examinations although the rules forbade the admission of anyone under twenty. In Rome, Mozart gave further evidence of his genius. During Holy Week each year by papal decree Allegri's Miserere, which was denied presentation anywhere else in the world, was performed. The only manuscript copy of it

was kept under lock and key. Mozart heard the Miserere twice and wrote the whole complicated polyphonic score from memory. The pope was so impressed he conferred the Cross of the Golden Spur upon Mozart for the achieve-

In 1777 Mozart became 21 years old. He left Salzburg and went to Munich, Mannheim, and Paris. Musicians in those days were barely paid enough to live on. So he could not earn money. He returned to Salzburg in 1779 and obtained a new and better contract with the archbishop. Between 1780 and 1791, the year of his death, he composed six operas. The best-known of those operas today are The Marriage of Figaro, Don Giovanni, and The Magic Flute.

In 1782 Mozart married Constanza Weber. They had several children, but only two lived past infancy. Poverty and illness harassed the family. In three months in 1788 he wrote his three greatest symphonies, the thirty-ninth in E flat, fortieth in G Minor, and forty-first in C (known as the Jupiter Symphony).

Mozart lived to be only 35. He died, presumably of typhoid fever, on December 5, 1791 in Vienna. The night before, he summoned a few friends to his bedside, and they sang "Lacrymosa" from his Requiem. Midway through the singing he burst into tears. That night he received extreme unction and bade his family farewell. He died the next morning. The rumor that the Italian composer Antonio Salieri murdered him is unsupported by reputable scholars.

A handful of friends attended his funeral service at Saint Stephen's Cathedral. He was buried in a pauper's grave with no tombstone or marking to designate the place. After a life of hard work and poor health, he left more than eight hundred compositions for orchestra, for piano, and for singers.

Mozart was a genius whose career owed much to Italian musical fundamentals. Italians Americans can rightly consider Mozart's music as a part of our heritage.

On Sunday, October 25, 2015 the Visalia/Putignano, Italy Sister City Committee held a dedication ceremony honoring Ida Romanazzi and Pete Giotta at an open house at our Sister City trulli in Memorial Park at the corner of Main and Hall Street. Special invitations were sent to family members of Pete and Ida and to the Enrico Caruso Lodge. Committee members served dessert, coffee and tea to attendees.



Cookie Time

Cookies were unknown to us...the children of Italian immigrants. It was a few days before Christmas...Cookie Time!

There were seven of us. After dinner, Mama would lay the white tablecloth on the kitchen table to begin to make Italian Snowflakes. She poured two cups of whit flour in a heap on the tablecloth. To that, she added four eggs that she just gathered from the chicken house, one tablespoon of sugar, two or three tablespoons of Anise, and the juice from on fresh orange (about ½ cup).


2 cups flour 1 tablespoon of sugar 2-3 tablespoons of Anise ½ cup orange juice 4 eggs

Working with her hands, Mama would knead the ingredients into one big ball of dough. We watched. Mama would then heat up a big black pan on the wood stove. She greased it with two cups of Crisco. While Mama was busy rolling the dough into a long, thin, flat piece, Papa would watch the pan of hot Crisco. The flat pieces of dough were cooked in the hot oil. When they were done Papa would sprinkle the cookies with sugar and set them out to cool.


Remember there were 7 of us. So, we ate and laughed and we were so happy.

I am now 85 year old. I have always made Italian Snowflakes on Christmas and other special occasions. I don't work as had as Mama did. I use the electric mixer to mix the dough. After I have a nice round ball, I put the dough in the pasta machine and roll it out on setting #9. I cut the dough into thin strips on a whit tablecloth – just like Mama did. I also use an electric deep fryer to cook the Snowflakes. I heat the darling cooker up with two cups of Crisco and start cooking!! When the cookies are don, I place them on a platter and sprinkle them with sugar or powdered sugar. Friends and relatives just eat and eat.

This recipe is a one hundred year old secret recipe passed down from my mother's mother.




