

### Joseph LaBanca 1931 - 2017



It is with a very sad heart we announce the passing of Past State President Joseph LaBanca on December 12, 2017. Joe was born in the southern part of Italy. Soon after World War II he moved to Milano. There he attended an industrial school and worked as a manager of a furniture manufacturing company. Joe served in the Italian army for two years. At the age of 28 he married his sweetheart, Mary, and they both migrated to the United States in 1960. The had three children, Vince, Dino and Lorella. Their son Vince passed away earlier this year. Joe and Mary have four grandchildren who are the love of their lives.

In 1963 Joe started a business he called LaBanca Cabinets. A few years later he opened a construction company he called J.L. and Sons, Inc. Due to his high quality work and exceptional performance the California License Board offered him a position as a committee member of the board. At the young tender age of 55 Joe successfully retired from his two businesses. He also was a part owner of Rosa's Italian Restaurantin Ontario.

In 1968 Joe joined the Order Sons of Italy which was the beginning of his many years of service and dedication, not only with the Order but with his heritage. As a member of the Hacienda Lodge he held many positions including that of president for four years. Then in 1997 he was elected our State Orator and in 2001 he was elected State Third Vice President. In 2003 he became the State Second Vice President and in 2007 he reached his goal as our State President. He did a magnificent job and won the hearts of many of our members.



On June 2nd in 2010 the President of Italy, the honorable George Napolitano awarded Joe with the title of Commendatory.


Joe was also the State Deputy to the United Lodges of Southern California We will miss his gentle smile and his dedication. Rest in peace Joe you will be missed.





One function of Justice is to punish individuals who deliberately falsify. Wisdom depends upon truthfulness. It gives strength to the body and the mind. It builds character.

Mankind inevitably makes

mistakes. But Nature corrects errors. Putting one's hand in the fire will result in a painful burn. When people are mistaken about values, make bad decisions, and when they follow a wrong course they become confused and suffer emotionally. If, however, they are determined and persistent in every effort to do the right thing, they are rewarded.

There are social movements based on self-interest that deny that wisdom exists. They succeed for a time by being loud and frequent. But eventually the enemies of wisdom destroy themselves. It is important to recognize and dissociate ourselves from false friends. We will succeed by means of optimism and a positive mental attitude. We don't need any foolish stimulation that constantly demands our attention.

Civilization and culture thrive when and where wisdom is valued. Ancient communities personified wisdom. Rome paid tribute to the goddess of wisdom, known as Minerva. The Greeks knew her as Athena. She was the goddess of crafts and trade guilds, also of womanly arts, such as sewing, weaving, and spinning. Beautiful temples and shrines were built to honor her. Minerva had annual festivals. She was a virgin goddess. The owl was a symbol sacred to her.

Minerva is still with us today. She has been wonderfully depicted in modern European and American art and sculpture, and she has been affectionately represented in literature. Let's keep wisdom alive in our hearts.



Disclosures: I am an immigrant and I was always legal. When/if I decide to become a citizen, I will register as a Republican.

"Certain kinds of criminality are inherent in the Italian race. In the popular mind, crimes of personal violence, robbery, blackmail and extortion are peculiar to the people of Italy." (United States Immigration Commission -Dillingham report, 1911) ".... immigrants were blamed for taking American jobs. At the same time, racialist theories circulated in the press, advancing pseudo scientific theories that alleged that "Mediterranean" types were inherently inferior to people of northern European heritage. Drawings and songs caricaturing the new immigrants as childlike, criminal, or subhuman became sadly commonplace. One 1891 cartoon claimed that "If immigration was properly restricted, you would never be troubled with anarchism, socialism, the Mafia and such kindred evils!".....Catholic churches and charities were vandalized and burned, and Italians attacked by mobs. In the 1890s alone, more than 20 Italians were lynched."(-Passages extracted from the website of the Library of Congress on Italian immigration)

Foreigner. Migrant. I have been living in United States for 20 years, an Italian among Chinese, Latinos, Arabic, Indians, among people who live, work, volunteer, pay taxes here but often have to

face the same discrimination suffered by our great-grandparents. Many "Americans", even many among the ones that go by Cattaneo, Franchini, or Accursio forgot that their nonni had a thick accent that never went away; that they had to leave friends and family behind; that they had to face many challenges, to rebuild a life from ground zero, to reestablish connections and friendships, to learn, adapt, adjust. Migration offers great opportunities, but at a cost. And citizens of America, a country made by migrants, should be more aware of it. Migrants are still coming, some "illegally", many with fake ID... the lands to flee from were once Tuscany, Sicily or Liguria, or even Ireland, Germany, England. Now Iraq, China, Pakistan, Mexico, India. We have a population diverse in traditions, language, religion, culture, but it is not up to us to decide which are the colors, the gods, the idioms that are right and which are the ones that are not. Many Italians that came to the United States were good persons that worked hard, massacring their bones and spirit for a better life...but there were the Al Capones too, let's not forget that. It's just like nowadays. Our past history should teach us to be more hospitable, to be more acceptable towards people who prefer tamales over hamburgers, who practice Islamism over Catholicism, who wear a turban instead of a baseball cap.
