

Frank and Eileen DeSantis honored at Bowers on October 7th.

Good morning, I wish to acknowledge those who provided me the opportunity to serve our community.

First my wife, Eileen, who provided on going support to me for over 60 years while we were developing our own businesses along with the Italian Heritage and culture organizations. We both had immigrant parents, relatives and friends who provided us with the foundation we value.

Among those who were present at the onset were our immediate family, influential community leaders of the following cities which include Santa Ana, Orange, Tustin, Villa Park and Anaheim. Especially prominent and loyal was the Orange County Board of Supervisors. In addition to the offices of the Italian Consulate of Los Angeles The Order Sons of Italy, the local lodges especially the Renaissance Lodge and the State and National Lodge of the Order Sons Of Italy in America, Eileen and I established firm relationships with other institutions:

The University of California Irvine, University of California Long Beach, Chapman University and Bowers Museum.

Successful, long term ventures were developed with the educational institutions which continue until this day.

The major impact of interest began with the Columbus Quincentenary Celebration in 1992 with the Bower's Executive Peter Keller. This relationship has flourished during the past 26 vears and has stimulated and united

the entire Italian community which includes the Italian Lawyers of Orange County, the Italian women's club and the

Renaissance Lodge whose membership plus community business individuals were charter members of the Italian American Renaissance Foundation.

The Columbus monument in the court yard represents the solid relationship and presence of the Italian community in Orange County from 1992 until infinity. Other supporters not named yet are on the plaque and benches of the Columbus Monument. It is also thanks to them and much fundraising that allowed a contract with Bowers Museum to be established as the Italian Cultural Center of Orange County with Peter Keller in 1992. Before you leave, stop at the Monument and look at the names on the monument plaque who were generous supporters as well as were the charter members.

The primary intention of the Italian Renaissance Foundation and Italian presence in Orange County that this legacy be preserved and shared with future generations through programs offered such as scholarships, Italian Exhibits, Italian language classes and Italian cultural programs such as the Italian films offered just for this purpose.

Our Italian film program has existed for 25 years and is very successful with record attendance and the assistance of Bower's staff.

As you can see much effort has gone into establishing these programs for the community so they will continue for many years. Eileen and I and our family who also participated are very proud of these accomplishments for the benefit of all.

In closing we express our gratitude to Bowers Museum for being a big and wonderful part of it and also for hosting Columbus Day celebrations here every year since 1992.



Reminder of the past: Frank Ronzano was our lodge President in 1975; today, his daughter, Isabel, is our Past President. Also: Frank Ciavaglia came to us from Pastena, Italy, circa 1909. Along with eight Catallo brothers, he signed up with the Kerr-McGee Mining Company to work in their Dawson, New Mexico coal mines. As the mines began to closed down in 1925, Frank packed his (then) five member family into their Dodge convertible and moved to Clovis, Calif, where he had a cousin that owned a vineyard on Herndon Avenue, just east of Dry Creek and the Clovis Cemetery. His cousin wanted to return to Pastena, so Frank traded the deed of his own property in Italy for the acreage in Clovis. The farm include a tractor, but Frank preferred horse drawn equipment, so he bought a Percheron Dray which he kept in a barn and corral that was built next to the berm on

Dry Creek. Later, he joined Jim Sirimarco in petitioning for a new lodge to be formed in Clovis, The Sons of Italy, to be named Rodolfo Valentino Lodge #1449. It would be dedicated to the memory of recently deceased Rudolf Valentino, a then famous Hollywood movie actor ... the romantic heart-throb of all red-blooded American women of the day. Jim Sirimarco, at the time, was a shoemaker, with a shop on the west side of the 500 block on Clovis Avenue. A few years later, in a poker game, Jim won title to a restaurant on the west side of the same street. He changed the name to Jim's Place and it became a popular spot for the locals to gather and enjoy great Italian and American dishes. He ran the restaurant until he retired and turned over the operations to his son, Jim, Jr, who remained a member of the lodge. Another co-signer on the lodge application petition was Jim, Sr's, brother-inlaw, Ciriaco DeLuca, whose daughter, Verona, is still a member.



The Fox

The fox is an interesting animal and one of the most popular in art, literature, and crafts. The fox is a small animal related to the dog, known for being hard to catch. Some can run as fast as 45 miles an hour. The gray fox can climb a tree as fast as a cat. The fox is pictured as the cleverest animal. So to "out fox" a fox is quite a feat. It is also known as a trickster.

In the Artic, foxes travel in packs. They are white in the winter snow but turn brown in the summer, making them difficult to spot. Foxes live underground when their cubs are born and raised. The father digs the burrow, but often foxes use holes other animals have abandoned. The father brings the cubs food. When the cubs are old enough to hunt, the family leaves the den and doesn't return.

In ancient Lydia the fox was the totem of the god Dionysus. In animal form the god was called Bassareus. The priestesses and cultists of his ancient mystery wore fox-skins as a badge of their office.

For many years, foxes were trapped and hunted because their furs were used for fashionable apparel. They were also ritually hunted for sport, as in the foxhunt. People also raised foxes on fox farms. The pelt of a silver and platinum fox was worth almost a thousand dollars. Once in a while, a fox became a domesticated pet.

Foxes were know to anger farmers by stealing chickens, but foxes assisted farmers by killing rabbits, rats, mice, and insects that eat crops. Today, foxes are much less hunted and are protected by conservationists. Foxes have been successfully employed to control pests on fruit farms.

Aesop used the fox in several of his fables to demonstrate in each a moral. The writer, historian, and diplomat Niccolo Machiavelli (1469 – 1527) wrote in his famous treatise The Prince: "A prince must learn from the fox and the lion because a lion is defenseless against traps and a fox is defenseless against wolves.




