

Copper

Copper is sometimes found in the earth as a free metal and is easy to work with. Most other metals are found only in ores and are difficult to extract and work with. Copper has been important in the development of civilization. It has been used to make alloys. To form an alloy, metals are heated and melted together. One of the first alloys invented was bronze, which is made of copper and tin.

Man learned to use bronze long before he learned to use iron. Bronze was used to make some of the first tools, weapons, armor, and artifacts. Bronze has been used to make statues and bells, too. The Native Americans in South America were still in their Bronze Age when Columbus discovered the New World.

Brass is another alloy that man invented. It is an alloy of copper and zinc. Bronze and brass, unlike iron, don't rust or corrode so they are used for making objects left outdoors, and brass is used aboard ships and boats at sea. Copper, bronze, and brass can withstand heat and cold, wind and rain, and continual handling. Some buildings and weather vanes are trimmed with copper. The trumpet and the trombone are made of brass.

Silver is a precious, natural element. The silver used to make various everyday items is an alloy of silver and copper. Because pure silver is too soft to be strong and durable, copper is fused into it. Sterling silver, used for formal tableware, is mostly silver.

Copper has been used for coinage since ancient times. The silver used in coinage often has copper in it. American "nickels" have been an alloy of nickel and copper. Yellow gold has copper in it. (White gold contains silvery metal, not copper.) Many medals are

made of copper or its alloys. And copper is used for lining and coating items and parts.

The value of metals in a coin shouldn't exceed the value of the coin. When the cost of a metal rises above the stamped value on a coin, government mints use cheap alloys instead. U.S. copper cents, for example, dated before 1982 have much more valuable copper in them than those minted after this date. It costs less to mint the new alloys. The coins of mostly alloy have less of the valuable metal in them, and they weigh less on a scale than the older coins they replace.

Copper is an excellent conductor of electricity so it was one of the first metals used in wiring and circuitry. Copper was once more plentiful than it is today. The earth's natural resources are limited. Less valuable substitutes are now often used for wiring. Copper carries heat well. Many cooking pans and heating and cooling appliances are made of it. Copper tubing is installed in buildings to carry hot and cold tap water.


Because of its importance to civilization, copper was considered sacred to Venus, the goddess of love and beauty. Her major shrine was located on Cyprus, the Isle of Copper, a chief mining and copper-working center of the ancient world. She was called Cyprian Aphrodite or Cyprian Venus -- the Goddess of Copper

Copper is prized for its color and can be given a high polish. It is a beautiful reddish-brown or reddish-yellow metal. It can be skillfully bent and shaped so it is used to make engravings and works of art. The uses and value of copper will increase over the years. Its atomic number is 29. Its symbol is Cu. Copper was first discovered in California in 1840, in Los Angeles County.



The area around Rome has a history of human occupation that spans over 14,000 years. Our own founding fathers were well read and fully aware of history, and so patterned the fledgling United States of America after the example of the Roman Republic instead of the democracy espoused by the Greeks.




