I trust everyone had a wonderful Thanksgiving with family and friends. We have a lot to be thankful for in this country and we owe it all to the men and women who have sacrificed so much for our freedom.

Well here it is December and time to celebrate Christmas. In Italy Christmas is a major holiday...which means Italians celebrate lots of great, unique Christmas traditions! Across Italy, "Natale" tends to be a family-centric holiday, a time to stay at home (and eat) with loved ones. However, customs vary from city to city, from exactly which dishes are served, to when to open presents, making every region an interesting place to enjoy the holidays.

Here are some of the most popular Christmas traditions in Italy.

Italians kick off the Christmas season (and start decorating) on the Day of the Immaculate Conception, December 8. Decorations and huge Christmas trees can be found in main piazzas, such as the front of the Colosseum or in Milan's Piazza Duomo. "Babbo Natale" (Father Christmas, the Italian version of Santa Claus) spreads holiday cheer.

During these eight days, also known as the "Novena", carolers singing traditional songs stroll the neighborhood. In Rome, southern Italy or Sicily "zampognari" or bagpipe players- travel from the nearby mountains to play their merry folklore carols. Along with the fancy lights, wreaths and trees, "presepi" (nativity scenes) are displayed in many churches and piazzas. Crafting these ornate works of art by hand remains an artisanal tradition in many parts of Italy. To go to the source, head to



the world-famous city of Naples for "presepi". There are whole streets with one workshop after another devoted to the craft.

Ask an Italian when her family opens gifts, and you will find that it depends on where they are from. Gifts are commonly exchanged on Christmas Day after lunch sometimes with the belief that Jesus delivered them—take that Santa. Smaller, northern Italian cities believe that the blind Saint Lucia brings gifts for children on December 13, so they open them that morning. Other families may wait until January 6. The Epiphany is when "la befana"—a kind of "good witch" who is believed to have followed the wise men, but got lost—drops off presents. "La befana" is a particular tradition in Rome and Bologna, where the main piazzas often host fun activities for the children; in Venice locals believe that "la befana" arrives every year by boat.

I could go on and on, but Italian traditions are too numerous for this article.







Music is a human invention. From the dawn of history music has played an important role in socializing and civilizing. Music evokes ideas and emotions. Music facilitates meditation. It can express any human emotion – tenderness, longing, worry, seriousness, loneliness, anger, jealousy, sadness, humor, contentment, hope, or joy.

Music reflects social values and sets the pace of social life. Various classes of people compose and listen to different genres of music. Compare the music of today to that of seventy-five years ago. And compare the music of teenagers living in cities to rural folks. There is a big difference. Radio, television, cinema, audio technology, and computers have made a great variety of Christmas music available to all people.

Music tells stories. Some songs promote radical social change, and other songs promote tradition. Music can be exclusively vocal or instrumental, and music is made by voice accompanied by instruments. Music anticipates the seasons and the calendar year. It is part of human nature. Special areas of the brain process music. But the human brain is so complex that music affects areas of the brain processing memory and critical thinking.

Christmas music narrates the birth of Jesus Christ. It is celebratory. It expresses hope and joy. It serves a traditional role in society. The first Christmas music was religious. Its themes facilitated Christian worship and personal spirituality. Gregorian chants were everywhere sung in cathedrals and chapels in Latin, such as the chant "Hodie Christus Natus Est" (Today Christ Is Born).

Eventually, much of the

Christmas music we enjoy adopted a secular role. Saint Francis of Assisi (1181-1226) advanced singing in the languages of the common people and arranged the first live nativity scene. Christmas minstrels of medieval Europe played music on pipes and small drums.

Christmas music includes all genres. Some remains religious. Many carols inspire religious devotion. The sixteenth-century carol "God Rest You Merry Gentlemen" is still performed to this day. Singing of carols for alms or charity began in England in the seventeenth century. Classical Christmas music has a European character, such as George F. Handel's oratorio "Messiah."

Christmas country music has a traditional American sound. Rockabilly and rock and roll celebrated Christmas in their own styles. The big bands of the 1930's and 1940's added to the lot of wonderful holiday music. It is not uncommon today to hear a variety of styles in a home or at a holiday event. Christmas music is enjoyed by millions of people around the world. Many children develop a love of music through listening to the songs and sounds of Christmas.

The Italian Americans have contributed much to Christmas music. In 1944, for example, Frank Sinatra backed by an orchestra under the direction of Axel Stordahl had a hit song on the Billboards pop singles chart with "White Christmas." Italian Americans have sponsored and supported Christmas benefit concerts that have raising hundreds of thousands of dollars. Christmas music has also been enriched by the modern Italian tenors Andrea Bocelli and Luciano Pavarotti.

Italian Wedding Cookie is not an actual cookie! It is a custom, with no specific recipe. First, it had to be home-made by the families involved in the wedding. Preferred cookies were Pignoli, Biscotti, Pizzella, Cucidati, Butter Cookies,

Seed Cookies, Anise Cookies, Lady Lock Cookies, and Peanut Butter Blossoms, with maybe a Fiore Fritto thrown in, but not Rum Balls. Italian and Eastern European emigrants to the Pittsburg, PA, area, circa 1885, and onward, have traditionally used a Cookie Table at their wedding receptions; cake was not yet a tradition for weddings; for many, cookies were for breakfast. At the party typical comment is "What wedding? I'm here for the cookies. The custom is also shared by Mexico, but there is no Spanish language equivalent for the practice. If you are from Calabria, yes, I know they take credit for it.


An old Italian proverb says: chi parla poco, gli basta la metà del cervello; or: The least said, the soonest mended.


lowed us around the complete exhibit. Don't miss this if you have a chance.
